## School Profile 2017–2018

St. Mary's International School (SMIS) is an all-boys K-12 international school that has been providing quality education in the Tokyo area for over 60 years. We have more than 900 students from approximately 50 different countries. Many of our students carry two or more passports and speak English and at least one other language. SMIS is an IB World School and is accredited by the Western Association of Schools and Colleges (WASC) and the Council of International Schools (CIS). We award both High School and International Baccalaureate Diplomas. There are 51 teachers in the high school, representing 16 nationalities. Class sizes are set at 24 maximum; however, many are fewer than 20.

Our international student body, rich in cultural and religious diversity, contributes to a unique and vibrant educational experience. Our programs are specifically designed to meet the educational and developmental needs of young men. Instruction is in English, apart from modern language courses in Japanese and French. Our graduates attend top institutions around the world, with the majority going to the U.S., Japan, Canada, the U.K., and Korea.

At SMIS, English is the language of instruction. 23 credits minimum are required for graduation. Specific credit requirements are as follows:

## Fine Arts and Activities



SMIS students are exceptionally active in the fine arts and other school activities. In 2016–17, over 120 high school students were enrolled in the men's choir, a third of the high school. The high school bands and choirs participate in both local and international music festivals and perform frequently for the Tokyo community. The SMIS Varsity Ensemble has won top honors and awards at numerous music festivals and competitions in Japan and abroad. They've performed for members of the Japanese Imperial family and have held charity concerts for Refugees International Japan and Hands on Tokyo. This past June, the Varsity Ensemble was honored to perform for the ANCA (Australia National Choral Association) Choral Fest in Brisbane, Australia.

## Athletics

SMIS high school students are encouraged to participate on athletic teams. SMIS is a member of the Kanto Plain Athletics Conference, which includes Department of Defense and local international schools (KPASSC). Our varsity athletes compete nationally and internationally in at least 11 major tournaments each year. In 2016–17, the cross country and wrestling teams captured their respective Far East Tournament titles, which is equivalent to a state championship in the U.S. A St. Mary's athlete captured the lone individual title in cross country while St. Mary's wrestlers were crowned champions in five weight classes. Varsity tennis and varsity basketball remained competitive with runner-up finishes in their tournaments. The swim team continues to dominate, winning their 44th consecutive Kanto Plain league title. Outside of the league, SMIS swim team members regularly qualify for national level competitions. In the past 25 years 50 graduates have gone on to join university swim teams in the U.S, UK, and elsewhere. The SMIS 2016–17 freestyle relay team was ranked first in Tokyo.



## Creativity, Action (Activity), Service (CAS)

CAS (Creativity, Action (Activity), and Service) is at the heart of the IB Diploma Program as students pursue a range of activities alongside their academic studies. Students select activities that meet the following criteria: they must be real and purposeful with significant outcomes; they should challenge the student to extend his achievable scope; they should be measurable by goals; and they should be reflected upon to show personal learning. Past CAS projects include building the school IB website (on-going), leading service groups, generating informational videos, organizing student led trips, and more.

# IB Diploma

The full IB Diploma program is open to all students in grades 11 and 12. 100% of St. Mary's high school students are enrolled in IB classes and 80% of current grade 11 and 12 students are full IB Diploma candidates. All students who take IB courses must sit for the exams. In 2017, 45 seniors obtained the full Diploma and achieved an average grade of 5 and an average point total of 32. Our students wrote 504 IB exams in 2017.
